HOPE AND SUFFERING





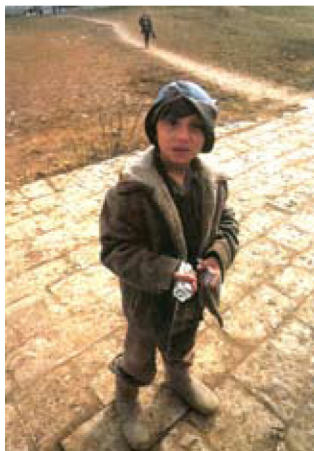
The greatest war photographers in the world have donated their most significant works to the *Mediterranean Foundation* for a permanent exhibit at the MAMT.
